FIRST READING

Amos 8:4-7

A reading from the prophet Amos

The Lord God spoke against those who buy the poor for money. Listen to this, you who trample on the needy and try to suppress the poor people of the country, you who say, 'When will New Moon be over so that we can sell our corn, and sabbath, so that we can market our wheat? Then by lowering the bushel, raising the shekel, by swindling and money, and the needy for a pair of sandals, and get a price even for the sweepings of the wheat. The Lord swears it by the pride of Jacob, Never will I forget a single thing you have done!

C: The word of the Lord. All: Thanks be to God.

SECOND READING 1 Timothy 2:1-8

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to Timothy Let prayers be offered to God for everyone; he wants all people to be saved. My advice is that, first of all, there should be prayers offered for everyone – petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving – and especially for kings and others in authority, so that we may be able to live religious and view of two masters: he will either hate the first and love reverent lives in peace and quiet. To do this is right, and will please God our saviour: he wants everyone to be saved and reach full knowledge of the truth. For there is money: C: The Gospel of the Lord only one God, and there is only one mediator between God and mankind, himself a man, Christ Jesus, who sacri-

ficed himself as a ransom for them all. He is the evidence of this, sent at the appointed time, and I have been named a herald and apostle of it and – I am telling the truth and no lie – a teacher of the faith and the truth to the pagans. In every place, then, I want the men to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument.

GOSPEL

Luke 16:1-13

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke You cannot be slaves both of God and of money.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'There was a rich man and he had a steward who was denounced to him for being tampering with the scales, we can buy up the poor for wasteful with his property. He called for the man and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Draw me up an account of your stewardship because you are not to be my steward any longer." Then the steward said to himself, "Now that my master is taking the stewardship from me, what am I to do? Dig? I am not strong enough. Go begging? I should be too ashamed. Ah, I know what I will do to make sure that when I am dismissed from office there will be some to welcome me into their homes." 'Then he called his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, "How much do you owe my master?" "One hundred measures of oil," was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond; sit down straight away and write fifty." To another he said, "And you, sir, how much do you owe?" "One hundred measures of wheat," was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond and write eighty." 'The master praised the high to his throne yet stoops from the heights to look dishonest steward for his astuteness. For the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than are the children of light.
